

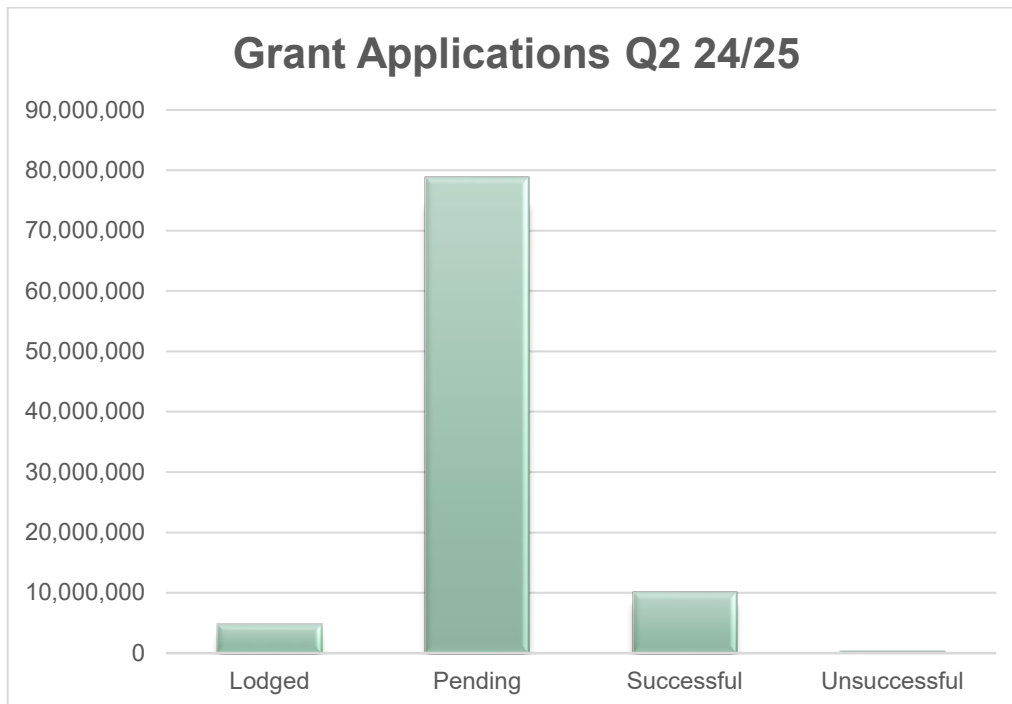

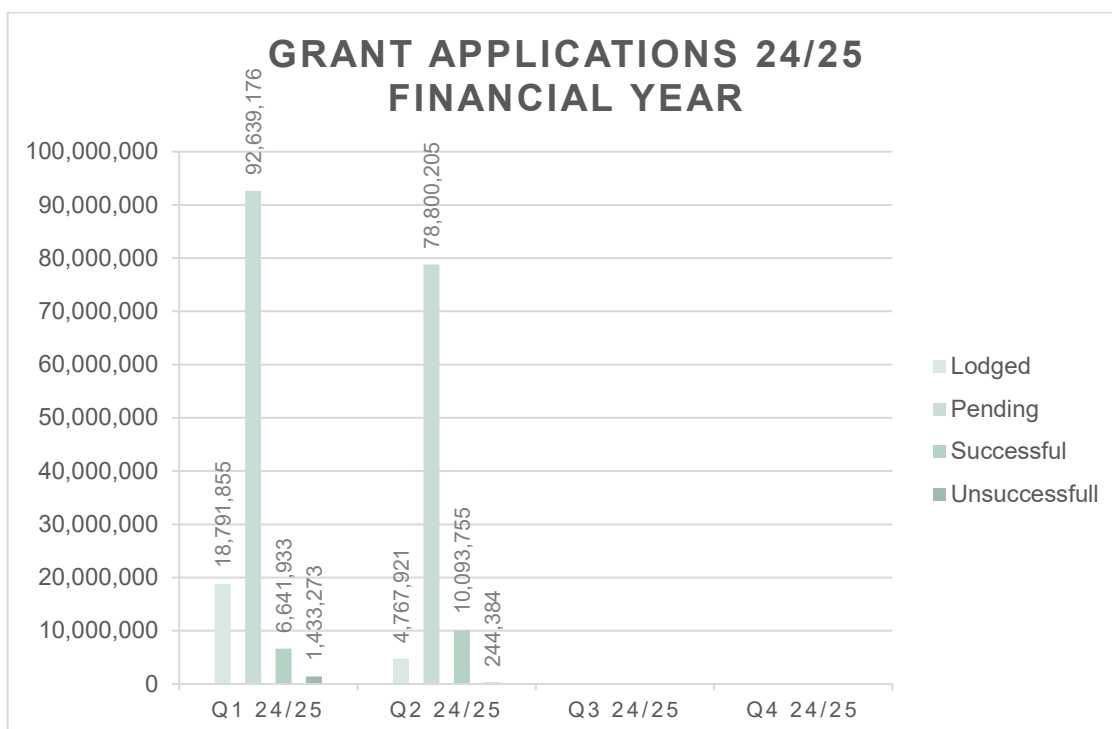

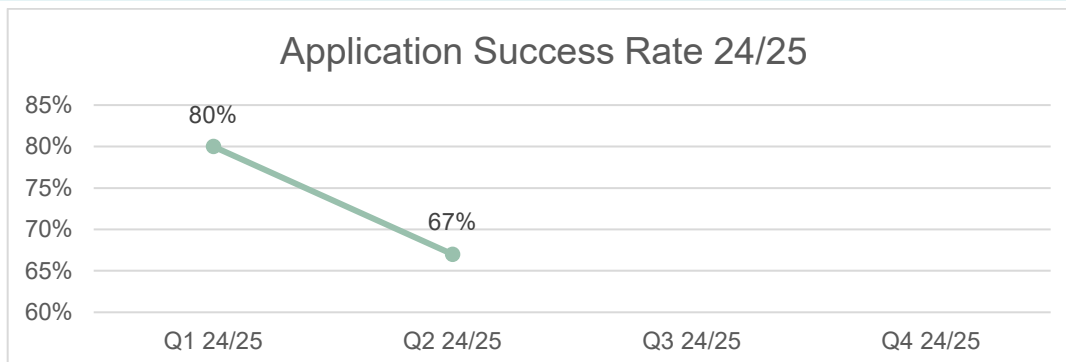

### 4. Grant funds attracted

- **\$10,093,756** secured with assistance by the Grants Officers this quarter.
- **\$78,800,205** worth of grants are still pending outcome.
- 55 grant submissions were lodged worth **\$4,767,921**.

### 5. Outcomes and benefits of successful applications

- \$1,125 to Parkes Shire Council under the Community Arts Support Program (CASAP) for fibre art workshops for the community run at Makerspace.
- \$4,640 to Alectown Community Inc under FRRR's Small & Vital Program for a new kitchen floor for the Alectown Soldiers Memorial Hall.
- \$70,000 to Parkes Musical & Dramatic Society under Club Grants Category 3 for digital microphones for the Little Theatre.
- \$1,075,812 and \$5,650,000 to Parkes Shire Council under the Regional Transport Resilience Fund for causeway upgrades across the Shire and to upgrade the Middle Trundle Road.

- Parkes Shire Council won the prestigious 2024 Overall Tidy Towns Award in November 2024 and will represent NSW at the Australian Tidy Towns Awards in Beechworth, Victoria in May. Council also won four categories at the Keep Australia Beautiful awards night for four grant projects and one event.
- The Parkes Wetlands Development won again at the 2024 Local Government NSW Excellence in the Environment Awards. Parkes was the Overall Winner of the Natural Environment Protection & Enhancement: On-Ground Works Award in Division A (population <30,000).
